- Listening to your worries.
- Making sure adults behave properly around you.

- Respect you and your feelings.
- Keep you safe while you are with us.
- Act quickly if something is wrong.

What is NOT OK

These things are never OK:

- · Hurting you physically.
- Making you feel scared, upset, or uncomfortable.
- Bullying, online or in person.
- Touching you in a way that feels wrong.
- Saying unkind or disrespectful things.

If you feel unsafe or worried, you can talk to:

- Mrs Ellis, Miss Jones or Mrs Marks.
- Any trusted adult in the school.
- Your parent or carer.

How We Keep Things Private

- We keep your worries private.
- But if you are in danger, we must share it with someone who can help keep you safe.
